Administrative Investigation Reference: OIA # 2017-IA-014

#### Background:

On September 17, 2017, at approximately 0156 hrs, Ofc Nicholas was on duty and assigned to districts 2/3. Ofc Nicholas spent over one hour with Ofc Sylvia at her residence while she was off duty in the Gladden Farms area (District 1) for personal reasons while he was on duty. At approximately 0703 hrs, Ofc Cazares ran two license plates associated with vehicles in the area around Ofc Sylvia's residence for personal reasons, attempting to find out who Ofc Nicholas had spent time with earlier in the night. Ofc Nicholas and Ofc Cazares work together on the same shift and are on the same squad. Ofc Nicholas has had prior sexual relationships with both Ofc Sylvia and Ofc Cazares.

# **Investigative Details:**

The following personnel were interviewed as part of this investigation:

Each MPD employee was served with a copy of the MPD Employee Administrative Interview – Advice of Rights / Notice of Investigation (NOI) form. Each employee read the form and stated they understood their rights. The forms were signed by each employee and are included in this case file. All of the interviews were audio recorded and transcribed.

### **Pre-Interview Information:**

On September 17, 2017, at approximately 0800 hrs, Ofc contacted me via telephone advising of possible officer misconduct. Ofc told me that Ofc Cazares texted her and told her that Ofc Nicholas had lied to her (Ofc Cazares). Ofc Cazares further detailed that Ofc Nicholas had spent time at Ofc Sylvia's residence earlier that morning while on duty. This information was gleaned from GPS on the Spillman mapping module. Ofc Cazares then told she had been during his shift, and that one of the plates returned to Ofc Sylvia. Both Ofc Cazares and Ofc Nicholas were on duty during this time period.

I advised Captain Jimenez the same day of the allegation of officer misconduct via telephone. After briefing Captain Jimenez, Deputy Chief Nunez, and Chief Rozema, I was given authorization to initiate an OIA investigation reference this matter.

#### **Summary of Interviews:**

Note: See transcripts for complete details on each interview. MPD personnel will typically be referred to by first name for ease of writing and understanding.

On September 20, 2017, at approximately 1252 hrs, I spoke with in the OIA office.
that on September 17, 2017, received a text message from Ofc Dionysius Cazares (DD) explaining that Daniel Nicholas had lied to DD. DD then stated that Daniel has been at Kyla Sylvia's residence earlier that morning while on duty for an hour. DD a picture via text message of the Spillman mapping screen that showed Daniel's GPS plotting in the area of in the Gladden Farms area. The time stamp on the Spillman mapping screen was approximately 0248 hrs. DD then stated that she got nosey, so she ran license plates associated with the area of the residence, and one of the vehicles returned to (Kyla's husband). DD then stated that she lied and told Daniel that someone had asked her to run the plates. Questioned if DD had run the license plates to a vehicle. DD told she ran the plates because she knew that Daniel's fiancée lives in another subdivision (San Lucas) and she was curious who he saw for so long. Asked DD to call on the telephone.  **Please see the screenshots of the text conversation and DD for complete details and context.**
me that telephone conversation with DD revolved around belief that DD had committed an Arizona Criminal Justice Information System (ACJIS) violation by running the license plates for a non-law enforcement related purpose. DD told Daniel had been assigned to District 2/3 that night with her (DD).
On September 20, 2017, at approximately 1436 hrs, I spoke with in the OIA office.
Kyla Sylvia-
On September 21, 2017, at approximately 2115 hrs, I spoke with Kyla Sylvia in the OIA office. Kyla is currently assigned to Squad 3 as a patrol officer. Her direct supervisor is LPO Brian Neuman (acting Sgt).
Kyla confirmed that she worked 1400-2400 hrs on September 16, 2017, and logged off at midnight. This is her typical swing shift schedule. Kyla categorized her relationship with DD as being strictly work related. Kyla categorized her relationship with Daniel as being work related. Kyla told me that she is staying with a friend at a residence in Gladden Farms, while going through a divorce. Her patrol vehicle and personal vehicle (2012 black Ford Focus) are parked at the residence. Kyla told me that Daniel came over to that residence on duty sometime after midnight for approximately one hour. Initially, they were speaking outside in the driveway area, and then they both entered the residence and were speaking in the living room. Daniel brought his work laptop (MDC) in with him. **It should be noted that the GPS

hardware module that tracks locations in Spillman CAD is housed inside the MDC\*\* Kyla advised that

she witnessed Daniel going "10-8" on his MDC to refresh the timer while inside the residence. Kyla estimated that she was outside the residence in the driveway with him for approximately 20 minutes, and inside the residence with him for approximately 40 minutes. While he was at the residence, Kyla mentioned seeing Ofc. Allicia Caughlin and a squad group text message thread alert on Daniel's cell phone, but did not know what the content of the messages was. Kyla did not see any text messages from DD.

Kyla stated that they discussed how work was going, and nothing really of a personal nature. She noted that he mentioned being frustrated with work because of his difficultly getting a backup officer on calls. She mentioned that he doesn't really want to discuss personal issues with her.

Kyla remembered a conversation reference rumors of K	yla
and Daniel being involved. Kyla remembered told her to be careful due to possible OIA	
implications because Kyla was married and Nicholas was reportedly engaged. Kyla agreed that she had no	ot
heeded advice on the matter. Kyla agreed that the optics of this investigation were not good.	

Kyla then told me that her relationship with Daniel has not always been strictly professional and that they have been romantically involved in the past. Kyla stated that Daniel had been evasive about the status of his engagement. Daniel had told her that he was attempting to end the engagement to his fiancée and that his living situation with his fiancée was complicated. Kyla indicated that she stopped seeing Daniel romantically because she didn't know positively what his relationship status was, and she didn't want to be in the middle of any drama at his home. She indicated that she wanted to speak with Daniel on the night in question because she wanted honesty from him, but that nothing romantic happened that night while Daniel was on duty.

I advised Kyla that she was not to discuss this investigation with anyone per the NOI or she would be terminated.

I then requested to see her cell phone reference calls or text messages to or from Daniel on the night in question until now. Kyla agreed to this, and I walked with her to her patrol car so she could retrieve her phone. There were no text messages between Kyla and Daniel on the phone. She indicated she texted him once after he left her residence, and he never responded. She could not remember the contents of the text message. Because Daniel didn't respond, Kyla deleted the text thread. There was a phone call to and from Daniel on September 17, 2017, at approximately 0056 hrs and 0058 hrs. She made the outgoing call at 0056 hrs, and he returned the call at 0058 hrs. Kyla indicated that she was attempting to see if he was still coming over at that point, and he had not arrived at her residence yet. He did not pick up when she called, and he called her back.

# Art Figueroa –

On September 22, 2017, at approximately 1538 hrs, I spoke with Art Figueroa in the OIA office. Art is currently assigned to Squad 6 as a patrol sergeant. His direct supervisor is Lt DeStefano.

Art told me that he worked as the Squad 6 patrol supervisor on September 16, 2017, from 2100-0700 hrs. He further advised that he made district assignments in briefing, assigning Nicholas and DD to districts 2/3. Art detailed that he has set the expectation that officers are expected to remain in their assigned districts unless taking a meal break. Generally speaking, Art expects to be notified if officers are going to be out of district for an extended period of time. Art advised that he did not know that Daniel was out of district in the Gladden Farms area for an extended period of time. Art explained that he (Art) was busy with paperwork

that night, so he was in the office for an extended time period. Art told me it would raise alarm to him if he heard an officer get Code 20'd several times during the night, indicating that the officer was likely not working. Art advised that it was unacceptable to him for an officer to be out of district for extended periods, while at someone's residence for a non-law enforcement related purpose.

Art told me that on/around September 17, 2017, he heard DD mention in passing during a conversation with him that she had been at Daniel's residence at some point in the past. The comment struck Art as odd, primarily because Art knew that Daniel had a fiancée and that DD was going through a divorce. Art did not press the matter and did not challenge DD on why she was at Daniel's residence.

#### Daniel Nicholas-

On September 22, 2017, at approximately 1618 hrs, I spoke with Daniel Nicholas in the OIA office. Daniel is currently assigned to Squad 6 as a patrol officer. His direct supervisor is Sgt Figueroa.

Daniel recalled that he was assigned to district 2/3 the night of September 16, 2017. Daniel recalled that Art had given shift expectations to the squad at the beginning of the shift rotation. Specifically, Daniel recalled being instructed that it was his responsibility to respond to calls in his assigned district, stay proactive in his assigned district, and stay within the perimeters of his assigned district.

Daniel initially advised that he didn't recall if he deviated from that expectation on September 16, 2017. I then detailed to him how shortly after midnight on September 17, 2017, he logged a series of "10-8" commands from his MDC at 0156, 0211, 0233, and 0304 hrs. He was dispatched to a call at 0320 hrs. When asked what he was doing during that time period, he told me that he met up with an off duty officer, Kyla Sylvia, at her residence in the Gladden Farms area. Daniel advised that he did not have approval from his supervisor to be in district 1. Daniel told me that he took his MDC out of the vehicle and into Kyla's residence. He estimated that he got to Kyla's residence at approximately 0156 hrs and left at approximately 0304 hrs. Daniel advised that he spent time that night both inside and outside of Kyla's residence, with the majority of the time being inside her residence in the living room/kitchen area. Daniel advised that he believed that Kyla's roommate was home, but never saw anything to indicate that anyone else was at the residence other than the two of them. Daniel told me they discussed their personal lives and work. Daniel told me that Kyla was asking how his home life is. Daniel told me that he is engaged, and living with his fiancée in the San Lucas area.

When asked, Daniel told me that the nature of his relationship with Kyla was just a friendship. When asked if he had ever been romantically involved with Kyla, he told me no. When asked if he had ever been sexually involved with Kyla, he told me no. When confronted with the fact that Kyla had told me differently, he still denied the romantic/sexual nature of their relationship. When I asked him if he was telling me that his relationship with Kyla was completely and entirely just friendship and never sexual/romantic, he told me that they had been flirtatious in the past, but nothing had happened beyond that. I asked if he had ever been physical with Kyla, he told me no. Daniel told me that Kyla sent him a text message after he left her residence said something like, "Don't worry about what people say, there is nothing inappropriate about how we hang out". Daniel advised that he didn't respond to the text message.

Daniel told me that he had never been to Kyla's house prior to that night while on-duty, but had been there before off duty. Daniel told me that he has met up with Kyla before when he was on duty and she was off duty at the QT on Cortaro Rd for approximately 20-30 minutes.

Daniel told me that he probably got a text message from DD the morning that he had been at Kyla's house, but did not remember what the message said. Daniel then told me that message from DD said something about someone seeing his patrol vehicle at Kyla's residence and that she knew it was his because of the Spillman mapping screen. Daniel told me that DD sent additional messages that morning, but did not know what they said. When asked, Daniel told me that he had deleted all his text messages from DD from his phone. Daniel allowed me to look at his recent text log. There was nothing from DD in his message log from the night of incident to today. There was a phone call on September 11, 2017, from DD. Daniel then told me that he obtained a new cell phone earlier in the day.

When asked, Daniel described his relationship with DD as "friends and coworkers." He told me that they were not really friends anymore due to his friendship with Kyla. Daniel described that DD thought that his relationship with Kyla was more than just friends, and that DD thought that his friendship with Kyla was not good for him because Kyla could not be trusted.

When asked, Daniel admitted to having a romantic/sexual relationship with DD in the recent past. He told me that he stopped sleeping with DD approximately 1.5-2 months ago when DD brought up his relationship with Kyla.

I then told Daniel that I wanted to give him an additional opportunity to answer my questions fully and honestly. When asked again, Daniel admitted to having a sexual/romantic relationship with Kyla that ended around the same time he stopped sleeping with DD. Daniel advised that for a brief time period, he was sleeping with both Kyla and DD. He told me he stopped sleeping with Kyla because he questioned if she was actually getting divorced.

When I questioned Daniel on why he was untruthful with me when I asked him about the nature of his relationship with Kyla initially, he told me that he lied because he was fearful of the truth and/or real answer. He acknowledged that we had spoken prior to the interview starting, and how I had admonished him to be completely truthful with my line of questioning.

Daniel advised that on the night he was at Kyla's residence on duty, there was no sexual/physical activity that occurred, other than them kissing when he was leaving her residence.

I reminded Daniel of a conversation I had with him 4-5 months ago when I was assigned to patrol. I mentioned to Daniel at that time how I was hearing rumors about him being involved with Kyla. I cautioned him then due to the fact that Kyla was married and he is engaged. I reminded him at that time what we have an obligation to live our lives in a manner that our reputation and character are unsullied, both on and off duty. He told me during that conversation that nothing was going on and it was not a big deal. He acknowledged remembering the conversation and admitted that he did not heed my counsel.

### **Post-Interview Information:**

close proximity to Kyla's residence. It should be noted; Ofc Cazares did not initiate any law enforcement actions (traffic stop/stop-field interview) based off the running of these two license plates via Spillman or radio. There were no further MDC queries until later that evening when she returned to work at approximately 1832 hrs.

Based on the information gleaned from my interviews and querying Spillman radio logs, I met with Chief Rozema and advised that I believed a criminal probe into the alleged ACJIS violation by Ofc Cazares was warranted. Chief Rozema authorized me coordinating with CIU Sgt Pridgett on the matter. I presented my findings to Sgt Pridgett, Detective Kesterson, and Detective Jordan. Detective Kesterson coordinated with the Pima County Attorney's Office, who requested that she formally present the case to them. Detective Kesterson and Detective Jordan then interviewed Ofc Cazares reference the criminal probe under MPD #1709-1132. Under Miranda, Ofc Cazares made a statement to detectives. Please see the criminal case for details on Ofc Cazares's statement, as she was not interviewed by OIA due to her pending felony indictment.

Additionally, Detective Kesterson forwarded me two emails from Ofc Cazares's attorney reference this matter. Please see the attached emails for further information.

# **Prior Discipline:**

Neither Ofc Cazares or Ofc Nicholas has any recorded formal discipline pertaining to the MPD Discipline Matrix over the past two years.

# **Supplement Report:**

Deputy Chief Reuben Nunez requested that I document my reasoning for not interviewing Ofc Dionysius Cazares reference this investigation.

I spoke with Ofc Daniel Nicholas, Ofc Reference this Internal Affairs query. At the conclusion of the interviews, I presented the information that I had obtained to the Marana PD Criminal Investigations Unit (CIU) reference the criminal element regarding the potential ACJIS violations perpetrated by Ofc Cazares. Marana PD CIU subsequently initiated a criminal investigation under MPD #1709-1132. The criminal investigation led to a felony indictment against Ofc Cazares.

Ofc Cazares was questioned by MPD detectives regarding this incident on September 27, 2017. Post Miranda, she waived her rights and gave a statement to detectives. On October 6, 2017, Detective Debra Kesterson emailed me the transcript of her interview with Ofc Cazares. After reviewing the contents of the interview, I determined that there were no further clarifying questions that I needed to ask of Ofc Cazares. Detective Kesterson summarized her interview with Ofc Cazares via a supplement to the criminal case report in such a manner that I did not need to resummarize the interview in my Internal Affairs Report. The entire criminal case report is available to the Chain of Command for review regarding the OIA investigation. NFI

Background:

On September 17, 2017, a Marana officer informed Internal Affairs of a possible ACIJIS violation committed by Officer Cazares.

An internal investigation (2017-IA-014) revealed that the incident started when Officer Cazares was upset that Officer Nicholas was at a residence outside of his assigned district for over an hour during his shift. Officer Nicholas was not dispatched to that residence but his vehicle, which was equipped with GPS, showed he was there and not at his assigned area. After completing her shift, Officer Cazares responded to the location and ran registration checks on two license plates, verifying her suspicions that Officer Nicholas visited Officer Kyla Sylvia.

To separate the criminal from the administrative investigation, two separate investigations were initiated to address possible procedural violations (OIA 2017-IA-014) and the other to address potential criminal conduct (OIA 2017-IA-015 & CASE #1709-1132). Sergeant Chriswell Scott handled the administrative portion of the investigation and the criminal portion was assigned to Detectives Kesterson and Jordan.


During the course of the investigations, we received additional information that two officers were acting inappropriately while on duty dating back to July 2017. The investigation was assigned IA number 2017-IA-016 and involves Officers Sylvia, and Officer Nicholas.

Both Officers Sylvia and

were placed on imposed leave with pay pending

the outcome of the internal investigation.

The following MPD personnel were interviewed in the administrative investigation 2017-IA-014:



Officer Cazares

# Findings:

A chain of command review of this internal investigation was completed. Each level of the review identified policy violations and made disciplinary recommendations ranging from termination to written reprimands. The following highlights my findings and recommendations for each employee found in violation of department and Town policies:

# Officer D. Cazares #460:

Recommendations on discipline for Officer Cazares were addressed in OIA 2017-IA-015.

# Officer Dan Nicholas #466:

Officer Nicholas admits during his interview that he left his district and responded outside his assigned area to visit Officer Sylvia for about an hour from 2:00 a.m. to 3:00 a.m. [Nicholas' interview - page 6, line 11-15]. By not being available in his assigned area, Officer Nicholas was derelict in his duties in violation of the following General Orders:

# 130.25 On Duty Conduct Standards

- C. Prohibited on Duty Conduct: Employees are prohibited from engaging in any activity, action, or conduct that detracts from their obligations and responsibilities while on duty.
- D. Completion of Assignments: Employees are expected to thoroughly and professionally complete any and all assignments, duties, or tasks for which they are responsible.

<u>General Order - 130.7 General Standards of Expected Conduct</u> Employees shall not engage in any conduct, whether on or off duty, which is unbecoming or detrimental to their duties, position, or the Department. All employees shall conduct their private and professional lives in such a manner as to avoid adverse reflection upon the Department or themselves as employees of the Department. Employees shall treat each other and all persons with whom they have contact with respect and courtesy.

**Town of Marana Personnel Policies - Section 5-5-5 Grounds for Disciplinary Action**Grounds for disciplinary action, up to and including termination, include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (O). Inability or unwillingness to perform the assigned job; failure to perform assigned work in an efficient or effective manner.
- (R). Any action, on or off the job, bringing discredit to the Town.

In Officer Nicholas transcribed statement, page 9, line 21, Officer Nicholas was asked what the nature of his relationship was with Officer Sylvia and Nicholas replied "just a friendship." Nicholas was then asked if he was romantically or sexually involved with Sylvia and Nicholas replied "no".

In Officer Nicholas transcribed statement, page 19, lines 20-43, Officer Nicholas was asked "What was the purpose of you taking your MDC inside the house and sending a 10-8 while you're inside the house?" Officer Nicholas explains "It was mostly just so if a call came out where I was supposed to be, you know where they dispatched me so I could already be en-route."

It should be noted, there is an officer safety feature in Spillman, Marana's computer aided dispatch system, that alerts the dispatcher when an officer is out on a traffic stop or area check (code 9) over ten (10) minutes or is inactive over an hour. When a dispatcher gets the alert, they ask the officer for their "Code 20," (Status-welfare) and the officer responds with "Code 4" (Okay) and their location. If an officer does not respond or acknowledge the "code 20" then an immediate welfare check by a supervisor or another officer is required. If the officer does not respond with a "Code 4" then officers will respond to the officer's last known location.

Officer Nicholas' statements about sending multiple "10-8" (in-service) messages while inside the house including admitting that his supervisor did not know he was in a different district, shows a deliberate and concerted effort to deceive and conceal his actual location.

Officer Nicholas statements regarding his relationship with fellow officer Kyla Sylvia were untruthful and he finally admits to his untruthfulness [See Nicholas statement page 17 lines 33-41 and page 18 lines 1-43. Officer Nicholas is in violation of:

# General Order 130.19 Untruthfulness

- A. No employee shall knowingly make an untrue statement about a fact, either orally or in writing, in connection with any investigation, assignment or inquiry.
- C. Employees are required to report completely, honestly, and accurately all facts and information pertaining to any investigation, whether criminal or administrative, or other matter of concern to the Department.

**Town of Marana Personnel Policies - Section 5-5-5 Grounds for Disciplinary Action**Grounds for disciplinary action, up to and including termination, include, but are not limited to, the following:

A. Dishonesty, including, but not limited to, intentionally giving false information, intentionally falsifying records or making false statements when applying for employment, lying to supervisors in connection with the employee's job, or an investigation, giving false information or lying about the reason for an absence from work, or falsifying time sheets or other payroll records.

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

Pursuant to the discipline matrix, this is a sustained "E" violation: A violation of policy that involves <u>untruthfulness or other ethical offenses</u>, any felonious conduct, or offenses that create or pose the potential for critical adverse impact on public safety or the professional image of the department.

In accordance with General Orders and the Discipline Matrix, the recommendation is termination.

# Officer Kyla Sylvia #469:

On page 5, line 27-33 of Officer Sylvia's transcribed statement, Officer Sylvia admits that Officer Nicholas came to her residence after midnight and stated "We did talk just strictly like kind of his friend like work friend and that was all that happened......I know him as a work friend." During her interview, Officer Sylvia was asked what her relationship was with Officer Nicholas and she replied "work related" [page 2-line 34-36] and later admits that she and Officer Nicholas were involved [page 13, lines 37-43 & page 14, lines 1-8].

Officer Sylvia's contradictory statements about her relationship with Officer Nichols concerned me about the veracity of her statements; however, I did not find in this instance that her statements rose to a convincing level that she was being untruthful and in violation of General Order 130.19 Untruthfulness

Officer Sylvia admits observing Officer Nicholas "go 10-8 on his MDC... so they wouldn't call him on the radio" [page 7 lines 9-23]. Officer Sylvia did not correct Officer Nicholas nor did she report his dereliction of duty to her chain of command as required under:

# General Order - 130.5 Reporting Violations of Laws, Ordinances, General Orders

<u>or Policies Required</u>: Employees having knowledge of other employees violating laws, ordinances, Town Personnel Policies and Procedures or Administrative Directives, Department General Orders, policies or procedures, or otherwise disobeying orders, whether on or off duty, shall report such violation in writing to the Chief of Police through their chain of command.

General Order - 130.7 General Standards of Expected Conduct Employees shall not engage in any conduct, whether on or off duty, which is unbecoming or detrimental to their duties, position, or the Department. All employees shall conduct their private and professional lives in such a manner as to avoid adverse reflection upon the Department or themselves as employees of the Department. Employees shall treat each other and all persons with whom they have contact with respect and courtesy.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Pursuant to the discipline matrix, this is a <u>sustained "B" violation</u>: A violation of policy that does not involve a misuse of authority or an ethical offense and has some adverse impact on public safety or the professional image of the department.

In accordance with General Orders and the Discipline Matrix, the recommendation is a <u>Written</u> Reprimand.

# Addendum:

On Monday 10/16/2017, Officer Nicholas, who is currently on imposed leave with pay, was questioned about new allegations made in interviews (2017-IA-016) and refused to answer the Internal Affairs investigator's questions.

In a NOI (Notice of Investigation) form that Officer Nicholas signed, the NOI states: "If you refuse to answer questions relating to the performance of your official duties or fitness for duty, you will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal from the Police Department"

This admonition on the NOI was explained by Sergeant Scott to Officer Nicholas and Officer Nicholas still refused to cooperate with OIA. When the internal investigation on IA 2017-IA-016 is complete it will be reviewed by the officers' chain of command for recommendations.

On Wednesday October 18, 2017, Officer Cazares and Nicholas were interviewed regarding new information that was gleaned from witness statements and text messages regarding 2017-IA-014. Both officers confirmed the information that alleges Officer Nicholas while on duty visited Officer Cazares, who was off-duty, at Cazares home for several hours during his shift and watched movies and "made out" with Officer Cazares. See statements for details.

Following his interview, Officer Nicholas submitted his letter of resignation from the Marana Police Department.






Re: Investigation of Dionysius Cazares

Dear Malena:

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with some background information about Marana Police Department ("MPD") Officer Dionysius Cazares and the circumstances surrounding her case. I have been advised that you will be meeting with MPD Detective Kesterson this week to review her investigation into Officer Cazares' use of the ACJIS database on or about September 17, 2017. My understanding is that the criminal offense at issue is computer tampering, pursuant to A.R.S. § 13-2316(A)(7), and for the reasons set forth in this letter, I believe prosecution should be declined.

Officer Cazares is a relatively new police officer, having been hired by MPD in June 2015. Before that she had held a number of jobs, including as a health assistant at an elementary school, four years of service in the Marine Corps, where she worked as an administrator in charge of maintaining and updating the records documenting servicemen's personal and confidential information, and as a homemaker until her children were old enough to be in school. Officer Cazares has two kids, who are six and eight years old, and she has been married nearly 10 years, although she and her husband are very recently separated.

The conduct in this case occurred during an emotionally fraught time, stemming largely from Officer Cazares' separation from her husband. After Officer



Shortly after being hired by MPD, Officer Cazares became friends with another MPD Officer, Daniel Nicholas. After the separation and their friendship turned into a romantic relationship, but shortly before the incident at issue in this case, Officer Cazares broke things off when she learned that Officer Nicholas was engaged to be married to another woman. They continued as friends, but Officer Cazares was then told that Officer Nicholas was also romantically involved with another female MPD officer, which was deeply hurtful. She felt that her trust had been betrayed, and also that Officer Nicholas had taken advantage of their friendship and her circumstances following her separation and to make romantic advances.

During Officer Cazares' duty shift over September 16 and 17, she and Officer Nicholas were both assigned to sector 2 and 3 of the MPD patrol area. At one point, Officer Nicholas was called over the radio to respond to an issue at a high school in sector 1, but before he arrived on scene, Officer Cazares heard over the radio that the incident was resolved and Officer Nicholas was no longer needed. Nevertheless, when Officer Cazares looked at her squad car computer, she saw that the GPS tracker in his patrol vehicle showed that he was still in Sector 1, stopped in a neighborhood but not attached to a call. She and another officer who was on shift speculated that he must have been visiting one of his girlfriends' houses.

When Officer Cazares finished her shift and headed home, she drove past the neighborhood where she had seen Officer Nicholas' car lingering. As she did, she saw an MPD squad car parked in front of a house and made an emotional mistake, running the license plates of nearby vehicles through the ACJIS database. My understanding is

that when Officer Cazares was interviewed by Detective Kesterson, she recalled seeing the results of an ACJIS query on her monitor showing that one of the vehicles was registered to the husband of another MPD officer, and immediately closing the file. She does not recall actually running that plate, although she does not dispute that she did, and was surprised to learn from the detective that records showed she had run multiple additional plates at the same time. This fragmented recollection is illustrative of the extremely agitated emotional state she was in.

Afterward, Officer Cazares called told her about the ACJIS query she had conducted. Told Officer Cazares that this was a violation of the ACJIS rules, which Officer Cazares had not realized. After reporting for duty on September 27 and attending an annual training, Officer Cazares was told to find Detective Kesterson, who wanted to interview her. She immediately found the detective, waived her *Miranda* rights, and explained all of the above to her. My understanding is that part of the interview included a review of Officer Cazares's ACJIS search history, and her searches on September 17 were the only ones unrelated to a law enforcement investigation.

A.R.S. § 13-2316(A)(7) provides that "A person who acts without lawful authority or who exceeds lawful authorization of use commits computer tampering by...[k]nowingly obtaining any information that is required by law to be kept confidential or any records that are not public records by accessing any computer, computer system or network that is operated by this state, a political subdivision of this state, [or other agency]." My understanding is that Officer Cazares has admitted accessing ACJIS records for purposes unrelated to a law enforcement investigation. While this may have been negligent or reckless, as she should have understood the relevant ACJIS rules, her conduct indicates she did not act knowingly. Her immediate communication with about her misuse of the database shows a lack of understanding of the applicable ACJIS rules.<sup>2</sup>

Absent the requisite mental state, while Officer Cazares's conduct may well result in significant administrative discipline, it does not rise to the level of a criminal violation. If, however, you believe some criminal charges are appropriate, I believe it would be appropriate to exercise your discretion and refer the case for misdemeanor prosecution, which is permissible under A.R.S. § 13-604, as computer tampering under A.R.S. § 13-2316(A)(7) is a class 6 felony.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> I have been advised that the ACJIS certification test MPD administered to Officer Cazares when she first became an officer was conducted in an extremely lax manner that did not require a clear understanding of the rules in order to pass. The test was conducted in a group setting with other officers and dispatchers in the room, and if they did not know the answer to a question, they were able to confer with the other officers.

I have been advised that MPD will be initiating an administrative investigation of Officer Cazares' ACJIS use, the consequences of which could well include termination from the department. In addition to those internal consequences, there is a strong possibility that further complications with her AZPOST peace officer certification will follow. As a result, there is a likelihood that Officer Cazares' career as a police officer may come to an end due to this incident. In light of all the circumstances I believe those administrative consequences are significant enough of a punishment and additional criminal sanctions are unnecessary.

Officer Cazares was an inexperienced officer who did not understand the extent of the ACJIS rules and made an emotional mistake that she immediately reported to another officer. When she was questioned by Detective Kesterson, she cooperated fully and admitted her misconduct. Prior to this incident, there had been no question about the quality of her police work, her integrity as an officer, or her trustworthiness with confidential information, including during her career in the Marines. She is not a bad cop who deserves to be saddled with felony criminal charges, which will be a major hurdle to her ability to find work in another career.

I obviously do not have access to all of the facts contained in Detective Kesterson's investigation, but based on all of the above information, I believe criminal charges should be declined. Thank you for considering this information, I hope we can discuss the matter before any final decision is made regarding criminal charges.
